<u>Health Action Plans and</u> Medication Consent forms for 2025/2026

Health Action Plans and medication consent forms must be updated each school year. If your student has had a previous health action plan in place with the school (Asthma, Seizure, Bee Sting, Food Allergy, Anaphylactic Allergy, Migraine etc) please be sure to have them updated for the 25/26 school year. Blank health action plans will be mailed home in July. If for some reason your student does not receive a health plan in the mail, and you feel they would benefit from one, please see the following website

Forms for prescription medications that will be taken at school can be found on our website as well. Please note, prescription medication consent forms require a provider's signature.

Vaccination Updates for 2025/2026

(*required by the 30th day of the 25/26 school year: October 13, 2025*)

For the upcoming school year, all students will need the following immunizations or an appropriate waiver. Waivers are found on the Immunization Log sheet on the website listed above.

Kindergarten-6th grades

- 4 doses of polio
- 4 doses of DtaP/DT/Td
- 3 doses of hepatitis B
- 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) or history of disease documented by a qualified heath care professional
- 2 doses of MMR (measles, mumps, rubella)

What should I do?

Make sure your child is up to date on their vaccinations by checking your child's immunization record. To get your child up to date on their vaccinations:

- Make a vaccine appointment with your doctor or contact the Lincoln County Health Dept to determine eligibility.
- Ask the health care provider to complete the Student Immunization Record form. Return form(s) to the office.
- You can also visit the Wisconsin Immunization Registry to see if your child is missing or coming due for any immunizations.

Medication Pick Up

It is best practice to have a parent/guardian pick up student medications at the end of the school year to prevent student transportation of medication. Please arrange to pick your students medication up on either their last day, or during summer school. Please notify me if other arrangements need to be made.

Lastly, consider printing a "kid license" for younger children who are out exploring this summer.

Don't miss RWB Day 2025.



Counselors Corner

As we head into summer break, let's take a moment to reflect on the skills and strategies your children have been learning this year through our Second Step curriculum. These social-emotional lessons help build a strong foundation for academic success, healthy relationships, and lifelong well-being.

Here's a snapshot of what we focused on – and some fun ways to reinforce these lessons at home this summer!

Growth Mindset (Second Step: Skills for Learning)

Throughout the year, students learned how to stay focused, manage distractions, and persevere through challenges. We emphasized "the power of yet" — the belief that with effort and practice, they can learn anything.

Summer Activity Idea: Try something new as a family – like a puzzle, craft, or cooking recipe – and model using self-talk like, "This is tricky, but I can figure it out!"

Goal-Setting (Second Step: Skills for Learning & Emotion Management)

Students practiced setting personal and academic goals and using positive self-talk to stay motivated. They learned how their emotions can impact their success – and how to regulate them when working toward something important.

Summer Activity Idea: Encourage your child to set a summer goal. Use a goal-tracker or a jar with small rewards for progress milestones!



Career Readiness (Second Step: Applying Skills in Real-Life Situations)

Older students began exploring their interests, talents, and future possibilities, learning how social-emotional skills like teamwork, empathy, and problem-solving apply in the real world — including future jobs!

Summer Activity Idea: Ask your child what they want to be when they grow up and explore together what skills that job needs. Talk about how school helps build those skills.

Counselors Corner

Child Protection (Second Step Child Protection Unit)

This vital unit taught students about safe and unsafe situations, how to recognize unsafe touches, and the importance of talking to a trusted adult. They practiced assertive refusal and asking for help—messages we encourage families to reinforce.

Summer Safety Reminder: Revisit your family's safety plan. Review who your child's "trusted adults" are and make sure they know it's always okay to speak up.

Problem-Solving (Second Step: Problem Solving Unit)


Using tools like STEP — Say the problem, Think of solutions, Explore consequences, Pick the best solution — students developed strategies to manage peer conflict, make responsible decisions, and show empathy.

Summer Activity Idea: When your child faces a problem (big or small), walk through the STEPmodel together. Let them lead the problem-solving process with your support.



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


