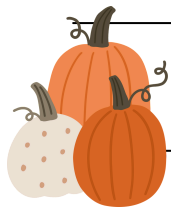

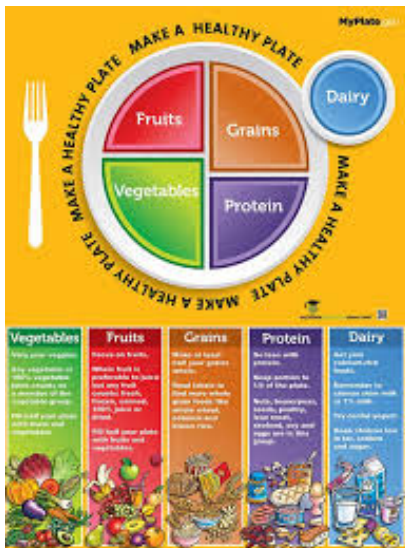

## ACIP Recommendations for Vaccination

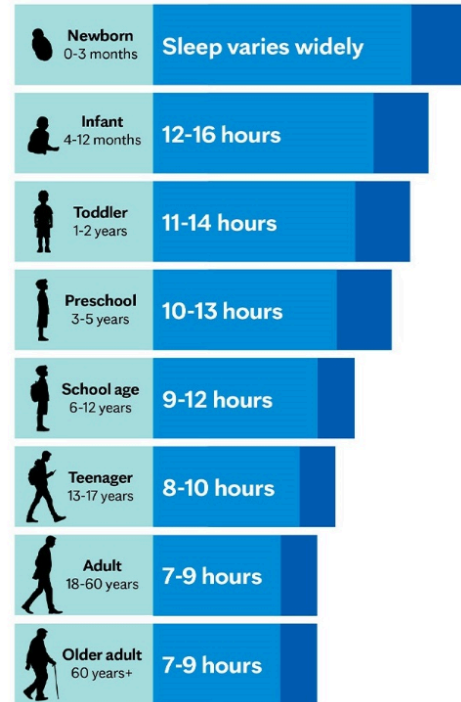
Similarly, COVID vaccines are updated to provide protection against currently circulating strains. Your primary provider may help determine if this vaccine is also right for you.

Did you know? Taste buds can change well into adulthood! Keep offering (and trying) a variety of foods even if you have already done so in the past. Modeling this behavior is key!

## Recommended sleep by age



In an effort to limit the amount of medication being handed out in building offices unnecessarily, please encourage your student to have a water bottle with them at school. Proper hydration helps reduce headaches, fatigue and mood swings. Medication should be a last resort for students feeling unwell. Proper sleep, hydration and well balanced meals will go far to keep students (and adults) healthy and feeling their best.

**What's Going On with SNAP?** Due to the federal shutdown, food aid through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) will end on November 1st. Even if the funding is restored at this point, many families will see a delay in available benefits due to administrative tasks required to make the actual payments. WPR reported that food banks are already seeing an increase in demand and that "food banks say they exist to fill the gaps in people's pantries, but not to fully cover an open-ended emergency".

**And SNAP in Wisconsin?** The Associated Press has a report on actions taken by each state to try to use state funds to maintain payments to families. The AP says, Wisconsin has 705,421 SNAP recipients. Gov. Tony Evers has asked the legislature to release \$69 million to help cover the shortfall in the state. Lawmakers have not taken action.

**What's Going On with WIC?** The Special Supplement Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) was on track to run out of funds in early October but received a boost of \$300 million from tariff revenues to maintain benefits through October. However, those funds may not last much longer.

## What can you do?

~ Donate to our local food pantry if you are able. This may include items like pet food, infant formula and/or monetary donation.

- Are American Indian or Alaska Native, as defined by the [Indian Health Care Improvement Act \(25 U.S.C 1603\)](#).

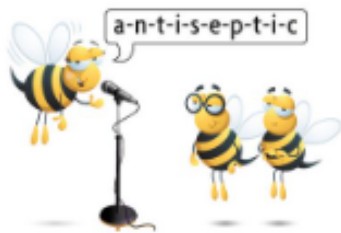


### Attention 4th and 5th Graders
