

Happy Fall Y'all!

The Health Office proves to be a busy place as we continue collecting immunization information for our annual report, set to be completed at the end of this month. Please be sure your students immunization records are either up to date or you have a waiver on file ASAP. Immunizations remain one of the safest and most effective ways to protect your student(s) and their communities from serious illness. Please talk with your students' primary care provider for further information. The Lincoln County Health Dept will have a vaccination clinic for eligible students coming soon, see the flyer below.

Unfortunately, we have also seen flares in GI upset and sinusitis in all three buildings. As a reminder, students should remain home if they are experiencing the following:

- ~Fever of 100.4 or greater (24 hours fever free without medication required to return)
- ~ Unexplained vomiting or diarrhea (24 hours without episode prior to returning)
- ~ Uncontrolled cough

Proper hand hygiene, a well rounded diet and a good night's rest are all great starting points for keeping your student well and ready for school.

(TES/TMS students need approx 9-11hrs sleep/night and THS students need approx 8-10hrs sleep/night according to the AAP).


Counselor Corner


October is **National Bullying Prevention Month**. We will begin our **Second Step Bullying Prevention lessons**, which focus on:

- Recognizing bullying
- Reporting bullying
- Refusing bullying
- Using bystander power

We'll be practicing the 3 R's:

- Recognize when bullying is happening
- Report it to a trusted adult
- Refuse to let bullying continue





Students will also learn the definition of bullying:

Bullying is when someone keeps being mean to someone else on purpose. The person it's happening to hasn't been able to make it stop. It is unfair and one-sided.

How Parents Can Support a Bully Prevention Hero at Home

- Talk Together: Ask your child what bullying means and listen to their ideas.
- **Practice Together**: Role-play how to respond if they see bullying.
- **Celebrate Kindness**: Notice and praise the kind things your child does each day.
- Check In Often: Ask, "How are things going with your friends?" or "Did you see anyone showing kindness today?"
- Be a Model: Show kindness, acceptance, and respect in your everyday interactions—kids learn most by watching you!

As a school, we will also be celebrating **Unity Day on Wednesday, October 22,** a nationwide event where we wear orange to stand together against bullying and for kindness, acceptance, and inclusion.

Together, we can help our school be a safe, supportive place for everyone!


